 - Restore the sense of wonder and appreciate the world
 - Reach the transcendental reality through symbolism
 - Explore Biblical themes and reflect upon them
 - Evoke emotion and stimulate thought, becoming more compassionate
 - Inspire creativity and see things through a new perspective



- It fades as we get older.


SENSE OF WONDER





- We can see order out of randomness; we can get a sense of wonder from trivial matters or objects in every day's life.

SYMBOLISM AND TRANSCENDENT REALITY

- Art often communicates through symbolism and metaphor. Biblical narratives are rich with symbols, parables, and allegories. Similarly, art can convey deeper spiritual truths beyond the literal.
- Art often points beyond the material world. It invites us to consider transcendent realities—the eternal, the divine, and the mysterious.
- Friedrich Schleiermacher (1768-1834): a sense and taste for the infinite.

FAITH

- Hiram Powers (1873)
- He made three busts to symbolize the Christian virtues of Faith, Hope, and Love.
- Faith wears a tiara bearing the Greek cross on the head. And she looks up to Heaven.
- Marble is a symbol of clarity, self-control and stability.

CHRIST BLESSING

- Giovanni Bellini (1500)
- Christ: Fully human, fully divine
- Golden rays from his head: Divinity
- The withered tree with the solitary bird: The New Covenant grows out of the Old Covenant.
- Rabbits: Resurrection
- Staff: Good shepherd
- Three robed persons: Witnesses
- Bell tower: Salvation through the church
- Dawn light: Victory over death and darkness.


EXPLORATION OF BIBLICAL THEMES

- Many works of art and pieces of literature are inspired by biblical stories and themes. By engaging with these works or relating Biblical themes to current situations, we can gain new insights into familiar narratives and teachings, leading to a deeper understanding of their faith.
- By exploring art, we learn to discern layers of meaning and connect them to our faith. For instance, a painting may depict the sacrifice of Christ, inviting us to reflect on redemption and grace.

THE PEACEABLE KINGDOM

- Edward Hicks (1846-1847)
- Quaker: Pacifist
- Isaiah
- On the left-hand side, the painting portrays that William Penn signed a peace treaty with Native Americans living in the Delaware Valley.
- A hope of peaceful coexistence.





CHRIST AND HIS MOTHER STUDYING THE SCRIPTURES

- Henry Ossawa Tanner (1908)
- Unlike traditional religious paintings that portray Christ as a "superhuman", Jesus in the painting looks like an ordinary child.
- Jesus Christ is fully divine yet fully human.

EMOTIONAL AND REFLECTIVE ENGAGEMENT

- Literature, poetry, and visual art evoke emotions and thoughts. They invite us to reflect on our own lives, struggles, and faith journey, thus cultivating our empathy and compassion.
- When we read a profound novel or stand before a moving painting or sculpture, we engage in a spiritual dialogue.
 These moments of reflection can lead to prayer, meditation, and spiritual growth.

RETURN OF THE MISSING CREW

- Frederick Bacon Barwell (1860)
- The young girl thought her lover is gone.
- Reversal of fortune may be around the corner.
- But, what if her lover was really dead?
- What would I do if I were her?




WOMAN IN A HAREM COURTYARD

- Luis Ricardo Falero (1875)
- A concubine in a courtyard is looking at a bird.
- Both are prisoners in spite of luxury.



PRODIGAL SON

- Thomas Hart Benton (1939-1941)
- The NT story has a happy ending: the son is forgiven by the father when returning home (unlimited chances).
- Alternate ending.

- 桃花依舊,人面全非。




INSPIRATION FOR WORSHIP AND CREATIVITY

- You may start to look at the world through a new perspective or a new lens, thus enriching your life.




- Formerly Crystal Cathedral
